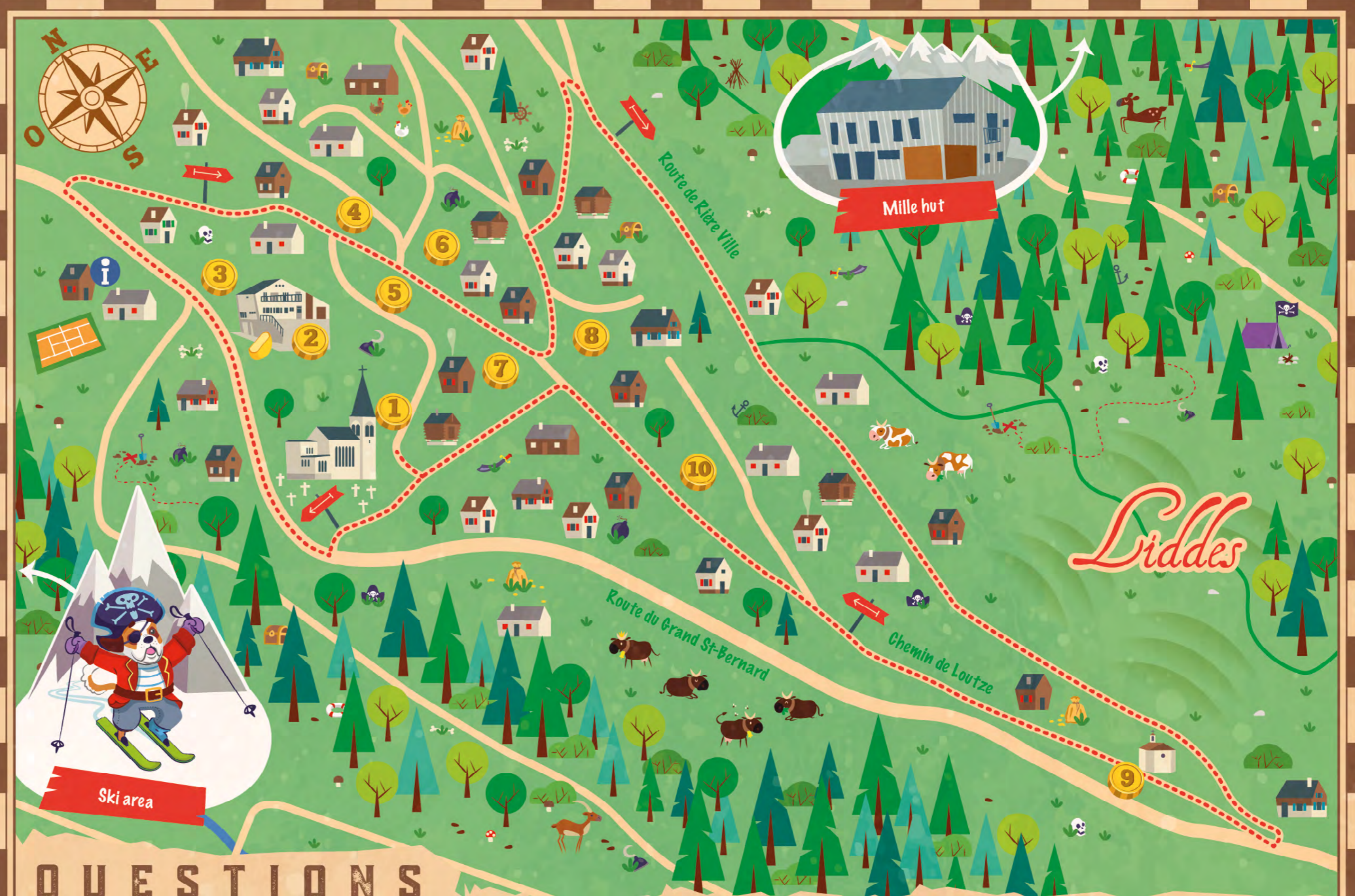

- 1** Opposite Liddes there is a wonderful ski area, namely:

- 2** Above this door at number 29, you can see the coat of arms of the Darbellay family, a family still very present in Liddes. What animal do you see there?
 (1) A lion (3) An elephant
 (2) A monkey (4) A marmot
- 3** The house after number 28 has a very distinctive architectural style. You can also see a beautiful painting. The musician on the left is playing.
 (1) A lyre (3) A trumpet

- 4** On the other side of the road, you can see a small figure on the green house that used to welcome walkers a long time ago. Do you think it is:

QUESTIONS

1 The start is in front of the town hall. Who is depicted on the medallion in front of you?
 (1) The President of Bourg-Saint-Pierre (3) Charlemagne
 (2) Bonaparte (4) Barberousse

2 To the right of the church you can see a Roman stone column. The letter T stands for the number 1 and the letter X for the number 10. You have to "translate" the letters and then add them up. What is the number in the middle of the pillar?
 (1) 10 (3) 24
 (2) 13 (4) 101

3 Behind the small balcony of the house with the green shutters you see a sundial. It is used to indicate
 (1) the time (3) the direction to Orsieres
 (2) tomorrow's weather (4) the centre of the earth

4 The Via Francigena route links Canterbury in England to Rome in Italy on foot via Bourg-Saint-Pierre. It is indicated on this yellow panel with a sticker and the number 70. What were the people walking this route called at the time? There is a clue at the bottom right of the sticker. You can see:

5 Turn around. At the foot of the bell tower you will find the history of this monument, one of the oldest in the Valais. It dates from the:
